# Mobilising Emergency Funding

The COVID-19 pandemic pushed many more women and children into poverty, putting them at increased risk of trafficking. For those already living in poverty, the effects of the global health crisis are multiplied.

The risk of exposure was high for local staff bravely working to coordinate the delivery of life-saving food and emergency supplies, performing crucial child protection checks and rescues.

Even with rigorous protection policies in place, many staff and children were diagnosed with COVID-19.

Your response was amazing.





### Your Generous Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic

Put simply, your support for an emergency COVID-19 relief fund enabled 3 Angels Nepal to continue their life-saving programs even in the midst of the pandemic's devastation.

Your contributions went directly to meeting immediate needs such as food, emergency supplies and medical packs. These packs contained pain relief and supplements to fortify those who had contracted COVID-19.

You also helped to provide urgent income relief for 3 Angels School teachers, providing stability and security for these passionate teachers—without whom the program in Pokhara would not be possible.

And as children returned to school it quickly became clear that most were arriving with only the clothing on their backs. So your support also helped to supply...

- Warm clothes and replacement school uniforms
- Nutritious food for students and children in the local community
- Computers and educational resources to support remote learning, and more.

While most students have returned to on-site learning, the school has increased its capacity for remote learning should further lockdowns be mandated, and increased the tools available for on-site learning.

Your emergency response saved lives and enabled local teams to continue to protect the most vulnerable. In a time of immense need, you stepped forward in generosity, and the impact of your action will be felt for years. Thank you.

# SOLD: Untold stories from Nepal



Sarita\* stared at the man from her village. She simply couldn't understand the words that were coming from his mouth.

Her body ached all over; her mind ached. She wanted to sleep. She wanted to go home. She wanted to hold her baby boy.

The man said again, "Sarita, you have been sold."

She shook her head.

Her husband had just been here by her hospital bed. He was coming back—wasn't he? *Stay here*, he had whispered. *I'll bring some medicine. We will go home*.

Her husband took her baby, her son. She never saw either of them again.

They had been married for three years when she discovered she was pregnant.

They struggled for food; there was no money coming in. The pressure of poverty—always present in their village near the border with India—was rising. The thought of a baby was both thrilling and terrifying. How would they be able to provide for a newborn?

Sarita says: "My husband told me, 'Look, here you are not able to get the things you need. You are pregnant. You need more money; a proper diet. I will take you to India and you will be treated well'."

They crossed the border and found a place to stay. Her husband seemed happier here—but Sarita was lonely and felt lost in a foreign land. As her due date approached, she was increasingly anxious for her child and her own health.

Her labour, when it came, was agonising. When her baby was born, she was not allowed to hold him; she caught only a glimpse as her husband whispered to her and then carried him away. Neither were in the room when she woke. Barely able to stand or walk, she shuffled through the corridors in search of them.

She stumbled into a group of men from her village. These are my people, she thought, dazed. They will help me find my baby. They will help me to go home.

She asked them if they'd seen her baby or her husband. They stared at her.

"Sarita, you've been sold."

It took her a long time to understand what they were telling her.

The villagers helped Sarita escape the traffickers by smuggling her onto a bus. One of them travelled with her so she wouldn't be alone.

Back at the border, he introduced her to staff from 3 Angels Nepal. She climbed into the car. It was only when she was inside the women's safe haven, within its walls, that terror loosened its grip on her throat and she began to breathe.

"I was so frightened," she says. "I was afraid that my husband would get a hold of me and sell me again."

With many other women in residence, Sarita is now part of a community and safe from the threat of trafficking which claims thousands of women and children each year.

Her parents still live in her village but will not welcome her back without her husband. She doesn't know where her baby is.

But with the help of her friends and the carers at 3 Angels Nepal, she has a stable base to begin, slowly, to heal from the trauma she has suffered.

"People care for me here," says Sarita. "I feel secure and loved."

### Your Impact Over Time

#### 2014

3 Angels Australia is launched, an Australian charity partnered with 3 Angels Nepal and driven by the vision of educating and empowering vulnerable women and young people to be free from the threat of human trafficking.

### 2020

Electrical, sanitation and hydrological designs completed for The Pokhara Project.

### 2011

Founders and Directors Steve and Robyn Raymond travel to Pokhara, Nepal as part of a fundraising effort for 3 Angels Nepal. Fundraising in Australia begins under the banner of "Newcastle Supports 3 Angels Nepal" and enables the purchase of a women's safe haven in Pokhara, a place of safety and restoration for women who survived or were threatened with trafficking.

#### 2015-2019

Land for The Pokhara Project is purchased in stages to fulfil the dream of Field Partner 3 Angels Nepal of a self-sufficient future and a long-term impact. Work begins with ground surveys and stakeholder engagement. Detailed architectural plans are drawn up for The Pokhara Project, including classrooms, a women's safe haven, vocational training facilities and a community medical centre. The new design is earthquake-proof and environmentally sustainable, with passive solar design principles.

### 03. Program Funding



Our Field Partner activities will seek to be both financially and environmentally sustainable—with an eye to long-term change.







Our development model is to work with one Field Partner at a time, on one project at a time, until they reach self-sufficiency.

This individualised approach means we can give our full attention to hearing, understanding and responding to a community's needs and strengths. It also allows us to build a real and authentic relationship with our Field Partner. This partnership becomes the bedrock for creating genuine, long-term community change.



### 3 Angels Nepal

3 Angels Nepal is an established, trusted and locally run NGO working in human trafficking hotspots. Established in 2004, 3 Angels Nepal is committed to its vision of a society free from human trafficking.

For almost 17 years, 3 Angels Nepal has worked in local Nepali communities to bring awareness to the dangers of trafficking, to educate and empower the most vulnerable, and to restore and rehabilitate those who have suffered from the trauma of trafficking.

Since 2011 they have been our dedicated and knowledgeable Field Partner. It is a tremendous honour to partner with them in this difficult work, to resource their local presence and multiply the impact of their expertise, compassion and courage.



### Pokhara, Nepal

The Pokhara region in Nepal is stunning. The snow-capped Himalayas and picturesque valleys draw thousands of tourists every year—yet this beautiful region is a known hot-spot for the horrors of human trafficking.

Poverty and a lack of education are the main drivers behind the \$150 billion industry of human trafficking. And in Pokhara the numbers are frightening:

- **20,000 women and young girls** are estimated to be trafficked out of Nepal each year, typically into child labour or the sex industry.
- **Every 17 minutes** another girl is trafficked out of Nepal.

Yet with your support, local partners are on the ground, intercepting traffickers and protecting the vulnerable:

- Over 53,000 people have been intercepted or rescued by our Field Partner since 2006.
- → 3 Angels Nepal's seven border monitoring stations stop an average of 12 women and children being trafficked every day.

### Together, We Are Making a Difference

The work of our Field Partner 3 Angels Nepal makes a powerful difference in the region of Pokhara and along the India-Nepal border. 3 Angels Nepal reported the following program outcomes during financial year 2021:



3,660 people rescued or intercepted



105 safe haven women restored



440+ students educated



150 children safe



1,870 people completed anti-human trafficking training



562 women entrepreneurs empowered



### An Interview with

# Rajendra Gautam

Founder and CEO of 3 Angels Nepal





### Q: What have been your most significant challenges this year?

A: Despite the huge challenge of COVID-19 this year, tireless efforts on the ground by our amazing team proved that nothing can prevent us loving and helping people even in the most difficult situations. Together with our generous and passionate supporters and partners, we have fought the battle caused by COVID-19.

### Q: What are the specific community needs that you are trying to address through 3 Angels Nepal?

A: Vulnerable communities are facing their highest risks ever since the pandemic. 3 Angels Nepal is trying to alleviate poverty at the community level through women's empowerment and job oppor-



tunities through our microfinance and cooperative banking program mainly in the agricultural sector. This means that women can work and earn their living and not be easily lured into slavery.

# Q: What progress or impact have you seen in the local communities through the work of 3 Angels Nepal?

A: There is a significant reduction of trafficking into India which was the main destination for decades. The traffickers' work has become more challenging as the awareness has drastically increased amongst communities and law enforcement has become stronger.

There is also a significant change at the community level now, because many women want to do micro-business to meet their daily needs.

### Q: What is your greatest achievement from the past 12 months?

A: Most of our women's safe haven graduates are engaged in micro-businesses, supporting themselves and even their dependent siblings and other family members.

### Q: Can you give us an update about The Pokhara Project? Where is it up to, and what happens next?

A: We are very excited that we are getting closer to the construction phase of The Pokhara Project. Although it has taken a long time, we are grateful to Give Freedom International for their continued passion and we are looking forward to breaking ground on site when fundraising targets are reached.

### Q: What gives you hope when you think about the future of this region?

A: Nothing compares to seeing smiles on the women's faces. It simply shows that they can change their community when they go back—with skills, knowledge, strength and hope.

# Q: If you could say something to Australian supporters who have helped to enable your work, what would you say?

A: I cannot thank the Australian supporters enough. They have stood firm with us in the battle. We have been able to rescue and intercept over 53,000 women and children since 2006 and educate them to make real change. This wouldn't have been possible without them. So, a BIG THANKS with gratitude to everyone involved in our journey.









# The Pokhara Project

The Pokhara Project is a sustainable building project that includes a self-funding school, women's safe haven, vulnerable children's homes, a community medical centre and vocational training facilities.

### **Project Update**

The project continues to move forward in Nepal. To date, we have **secured land for development,** conducted **land and geological surveys**, **drafted architectural plans** and completed **electrical, sanitation and hydrological designs.** 

The project has also recently completed a **riverworks survey**, required to facilitate riverworks designs and structural plans. This very exciting progression sees the overall project from the purchasing of the land onwards at 43% complete.

With all surveys and technical approvals met, the fourth and final phase of the project—construction—is set to commence.

The next chapter of The Pokhara Project calls for further fundraising to enable that construction to begin as soon as possible.

### **Project Milestones**

# Program Funds Distribution 2020-21

The COVID-19 pandemic necessitated a funding pivot to help meet urgent medical and physical needs.

Close to 40% of funds distributed to 3 Angels Nepal was for disaster relief and other emergency support, which enabled us to ensure children and vulnerable women were healthy and well during the pandemic (see page 10 for more on the impact of COVID-19).

The June 2021 end-of-financial-year campaign "SOLD: Untold stories from Nepal" was our largest ever mass market fundraising campaign to date (for combined program and operational income) and represented an 11.2% increase in total funds raised for the year.

The Give Freedom family has grown considerably this year, with the number of new supporters growing by more than 40 percent.


