Your gift will be used to construct a dedicated building containing two spacious homes in which up to 20 boys under the age of 12 can find healing, freedom and belonging.

Features include:

- Living capacity for up to 20 boys under the age of 12 and two qualified carers
- √ Home-based model of care
- ✓ Communal and private living spaces
- ✓ Large bedrooms
- ✓ Built-in laundry and internal bathroom facilities
- ✓ Secure, monitored premises
- ✓ Green spaces for community gatherings

Construction of all vulnerable children's homes will begin once funding targets have been reached—and your generosity will take us a critical step towards achieving this important goal.



Viśvāsa House and Śakti House are two spacious homes located side-by-side within a dedicated, freestanding building that is positioned in a more private area of the campus with other vulnerable children's homes.

The homes have been architecturally designed to help foster friendship and a sense of community among children, with a central village green and plenty of shared community spaces.

The layout of the homes is also designed to be flexible and adaptable to the current and future needs of 3 Angels Nepal and their beneficiaries.

Viśvāsa House and Śakti House will offer communal areas for socialising and learning, shared facilities such as a laundry and bathrooms, and private spaces that include separate bedrooms for the children and carers.

Each house can accommodate up to 10 boys at any given time and will be run on a home-based model of care. Practically,

this means two qualified carers—or house parents—will always be on hand to provide the boys with loving support and quidance.

Passive solar principles, incorporated into the building's design, will utilise the sun's energy to maintain a comfortable temperature indoors, and to keep energy costs low.

In Nepali, Viśvāsa means faith and Śakti means strength.
