Celebrating success



Our **Christmas Appeal** focused on raising funds for the women's safe haven. Thank you to everyone who shared our stories and gave generously. We raised \$84,773 and attracted new supporters to our social media platforms. To read more about the women's safe haven turn to page 32.



The **End of Financial Year Appeal** focused on introducing the vulnerable children's homes and was one of our most successful to date, raising \$221,579 including the full funding of Māyā house. Meet our Managing Director

Kath has been working at Give Freedom for several years and is the key driver behind most things happening at the organisation—including the new look and strategic direction. Here, in her own words, she tells us a bit more about where she has come from and what makes her tick.



Q: What inspired you to work with Give Freedom?

A: The cause! I have always had a strong passion and deep commitment to seek justice, equity and support for marginalised communities—to make a real difference in the lives of people who need it most.

It is my honour and privilege to help extend the vision and mission of Give Freedom International. What an incredible opportunity I have to personally contribute towards a world free from human trafficking and exploitation.

Q: What was the path you took to get to where you are today?

A: I suppose it all began with a TV advert. I was just eight years old when I saw a World Vision appeal showing children, the same age as me, living in extreme poverty and hardship. It left a lasting impression on me and I remember thinking "this is not right, I need to help." As a teenger I went to Papua New Guinea on a school trip, and this experience sparked a keen interest in knowing and understanding different cultures that were so vastly different from my experience here in Australia.

This curiosity led me to undertake a degree in International Development—which deepened my ideological and practical knowledge and understanding of the International Development sector. Part of this degree involved a visit to the Klong Toey Slum in Bangkok, Thailand—an experience I found deeply moving.

Since then I have learnt about the complexity of disaster relief and the appropriateness of aid while assisting victims of the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami in Thailand and distributing aid with the Indonesian Government after the 2013 Jakarta floods. I now have over twelve years of active non-profit business and marketing experience across the education and international development sectors—along with a Masters in Business. Ultimately though, I want to make a real difference in the lives of people who need it most, and contribute something good to the world. It is this passion that has driven me here.

Q: How would you describe your role as Managing Director?

A: I would describe it as a very big job! I oversee all strategic and operational aspects of Give Freedom International, including:

- Working with the board of directors to create and define our core vision, mission and values—also our strategy and governance.
- Working with our field partner to strengthen our local partnership and operational relationship.
- Creating and implementing our strategic framework and leading our core operational team to achieve our goals.

Business development, project management, strategic thinking and people focused leadership are my core skills. I am highly passionate about building strong foundations for Give Freedom to achieve its goals, as well as ensuring we get the right people in the right roles to help position us for success!

Q: What were your biggest accomplishments last year?

A: Last year was a massive year for Give Freedom and even personally for me as a mother of three young children!

A Groundbreaking Few Months

In May 2022 we launched our most significant strategic milestone to date-the Give Freedom Foundation.

The Foundation all began with a question: how can we make supporters' dollars go further? This question forced us to think strategically and focus on future growth and sustainability. We wanted to honour our supporters' gifts, knowing they are given so whole-heartedly and sacrificially.

With this key question in mind, we created our 100% Giving Model, an innovative funding model that is highly unique within the Australian charity sector.

The Give Freedom Foundation powers our distinctive model, covering all operational costs and allowing us to guarantee that every dollar you give goes to the field to support anti-human trafficking work.

We recently invited our very first foundation members to formally join us, and pledges have now been secured up to 2025. This essential tax-deductible funding is directed

towards operational costs like fundraising and administration and means every single dollar given by supporters can go directly to the field.

Funding from the Foundation has enabled Give Freedom's operational team to engage meaningfully with our current supporters and create high quality, informative campaigns. These campaigns and products, with supporting promotional materials, are already driving an increase in giving from supporters old and new.

Support has also allowed us to invest in database and project management systems, which in turn streamline our processes and improve communication with our supporters.

And finally, seed funding from the Foundation has enabled us to recruit experienced professionals who have been behind Give Freedom's successes this year.

Our Field Partnership

We continue to practice our international development model of working with one Field Partner at a time, on one project at a time, until they reach self-sufficiency.

This year, Give Freedom International has further cemented its strong relationship with 3 Angels Nepal, a partnership which has grown since 2011 through founders and directors Steve and Robyn Raymond.

3 Angels Nepal

Established in 2004, 3 Angels Nepal is committed to its vision of a society free from human trafficking.

It is a trusted and locally run NGO working to educate and empower the most vulnerable, and to restore and rehabilitate those who have been trafficked.



Making a difference together

Despite the financial difficulties caused by the prolonged global pandemic and escalating global unrest, 3 Angels Nepal continues to make a powerful difference in the Pokhara region.

Not only have they maintained daily intercepts and rescues of trafficked women and children, they have found new and innovative ways to support their beneficiaries.

Take for example COVID-19 lockdowns—we are all too aware how challenging these have been both on an individual and organisational level. Nepali communities also faced lockdowns, meaning the team at 3 Angels Nepal had to re-think the way they operated.

The school in particular was impacted, as the lockdown meant children couldn't physically come to the classroom. Resourcing and limited technological infrastructure made it hard for teachers to quickly pivot to online learning like schools in Australia did.

However, teachers at 3 Angels were given special government permission to hold virtual classes for their students, and they became the first school in Pokhara to deliver online learning. As students from the vulnerable children's homes were living together in a 'covid-safe bubble', they continued to be taught in person, while fee-paying pupils logged on to their lessons from home.

As further proof of their excellent work during COVID-19, 3 Angels Nepal received funding from the central Nepal Government to start a shoe making class.

Two classes, with a total of 35 young women, have already graduated from this new enterprise, having learnt the skills required to make shoes, and been given the materials and tools to do it.

"Some of the women have enjoyed this so much they have started their own successful shoe making businesses back in the community," said Rajendra, founder and CEO of 3 Angels Nepal.

This year has also seen the 3 Angels School presented with the British Council's International School Award. This global accreditation recognises good practices in incorporating international dimensions in schools. Students now have the opportunity to compete with peers from India, Bangladesh and Australia and develop their skills for life and work.

We look forward to sharing more outstanding achievements from the field over the coming months.

These are some of the program outcomes reported by 3 Angels Nepal during this year:



4837 people were rescued from slavery or had the trafficking process intercepted before they could be sold



167 women were given refuge at the 3 Angels Nepal safe haven—along with care and education



450 students received education at the 3 Angels Nepal school, preparing them for a brighter future



150 children are living in safe alternative housing where they can live, grow and thrive



6022 people completed anti-human trafficking training,

enabling them to be community spokespeople, leaders and advocates



562 women received entrepreneurial training and support to start their own businesses and forge their own futures

The Effects of COVID-19, Global Conflict and Escalating Poverty

Another tumultuous year for our world

Worldwide, the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic are still being felt deeply. 2022 has also seen escalating global conflict, along with increasing financial difficulties for families both here in Australia and abroad.

This year, it is estimated an additional 75 million to 95 million¹ people will be pushed into poverty because of COVID-19, growing inflationary pressures and the Ukraine conflict. It is a horrifying and heartbreaking number.

Globally to date the pandemic has resulted in:

- → 615 million cases
- → 6.5 million deaths²

Yet even with financial uncertainty and global heartbreak, people like you have responded with fierce generosity and love and have continued to support our mission.

In Nepal, our Field Partner suffered the effects of lockdowns, staff shortages and sickness replicated in communities across the world. More families being plunged into poverty means a greater number of women and children are at risk of being trafficked.

Give Freedom supported 3 Angels Nepal during this time with emergency funding. The money was put directly to use with immediate needs of food, emergency supplies and medical packs. These — Rajendra, 3 Angels Nepal CEO

"To alleviate pressure, and only when it was safe, we sent some children home to their families. The funds enabled us to send them home with supplies of rice, dahl, salt, sugar and cooking oil. They were basic supplies but vital for them to survive.

During these COVID times the only supporter we had was Give Freedom. We cannot thank you enough.

packs contained masks, hand sanitiser, pain relief and supplements to fortify those who had contracted COVID-19.

"If it wasn't for this emergency funding we would not have been able to have all the kids come back to the vulnerable children's homes because of the pressure for survival—traffickers would have sold them off. The children would have been re-trafficked.

"It is poverty which is driving these families into trafficking.

"The medical supplies also saved lives. In places with no supplies, no masks, no hand sanitiser, no basic medicines, many people died including parents and children.

"We cannot thank you enough for your continued support during this time."

Emergency Funding

All gifts made to Give Freedom International are directed to The Pokhara Project. However, there are times when our Field Partner requires disaster relief and other emergency funding. In these instances a limited proportion of funds can be directed to help. This flexibility enables 3 Angels Nepal to continue the work they are doing, while we strive to build their long-term capacity and sustainability.

Burning Twig Collaboration

This year we collaborated with a Pokhara-based media organisation for our End of Financial Year campaign.

Burning Twig is a digital arts company that has worked with over 50 international organisations. Their local team is made up of experienced photographers, videographers and graphic designers who are trained by Nepali and international experts.

We partnered with them to gather much needed new photos and video, most of which you would have seen in our most recent campaign. They were behind the production of multiple videos to support the End of Financial Year Appeal, and the fresh images we will be utilising over the coming months as we continue to promote The Pokhaha Project.

The intentional support of a local business sits centrally within our international development philosophy, which we are currently in the process of refining, and are looking forward to sharing with you in next year's annual report.

Our New Online Resource

Education is powerful. It has the potential to spark action and give freedom.

This is why in February we launched our online education resource for people to learn more about human trafficking and modern slavery.

The page can make confronting reading. At 40.3 million, the number of modern-day slaves is now higher than any other time in history. But this is why it's more important than ever to stay educated about this heartbreaking issue.

Through a series of graphics and powerful imagery, the webpage details the many complex forms human trafficking takes and how 3 Angels Nepal is working on the frontlines to rescue, rehabilitate and educate.

Since its launch in February, the platform has been viewed hundreds of times and is our third most visited page on the Give Freedom website. It has been used in schools here in Australia to teach the next generation of change-makers and it is equipping people with the information they need to understand this global topic, as well as inspiring others to take action.

The Pokhara Project

A reminder of what it's all about!

Give Freedom's focus remains on supporting our Field Partner, 3 Angels Nepal, to become self-sufficient by building them a long-term home.

The Pokhara Project is a sustainable building project that includes everything 3 Angels Nepal need to fight human trafficking through rescue, prevention and rehabilitation.

With the land, surveys and architectural plans completed, we are excited to start riverworks at the end of the year –pending the relevant permits and approvals. This important phase will stabilise the Seti riverbank by building a retaining wall and draining excess surface water on site.

Moving forward we continue to fundraise for this ambitious project with a productisation strategy designed to focus individual giving towards different interests and capacities. This will include a focus on the self-funding school and vocational training facilities.

Women's Safe Haven

Every year thousands of women and young girls are trafficked out of Nepal and into a life of slavery.

Many are taken from their homes to work as sex slaves in the brothels of India, where they face abuse, fear, and a life without hope.

Take Ashra^{*}, a young Nepali mother who was trafficked across the Nepal-India border and sold into a life of violent sexual abuse and slavery.

She was tortured and beaten for not doing what she was told and became suicidal as the months of captivity slipped by.

Miraculously Ashra managed to escape one night, and travelled back to Nepal where the local authorities helped negotiate her daughter's release. It was a year before mother and daughter were finally reunited.

Every year 3 Angels Nepal rescues thousands of women and girls like Ashra who have been sold into a life of slavery. Many of these women are able to be

3 Angels Nepal did more than I could ever have imagined. My life has a new beginning. reunited with their families, but in a lot of cases this is not possible or safe.

The safe haven is a place of refuge, a place of healing, of understanding and importantly a place of shared sisterhood, where rescued women can recover from their trauma.

Here they can receive healthcare, counselling and legal aid. It is also a place to learn new skills which in turn will help them start new lives with a sustainable income.

When Ashra was reunited with her daughter she knew they needed safety, healing and help to rebuild their lives. She heard about 3 Angels Nepal and was taken into the safe haven where they received care and education.

"I started to hope that we could build a life for ourselves again," she said.

Ashra completed vocational education, including training in border security, and her daughter started school. Today Ashra works at the 3 Angels Nepal India-Nepal checkpoint, where she intercepts traffickers and

prevents girls from experiencing a similar life of slavery.

"3 Angels Nepal did more than I could ever have imagined," she said. **"My life has a new beginning."**

The new women's safe haven planned for The Pokhara Project will be low maintenance, sustainable and built to withstand Nepal's level 5 earthquake zone and extreme monsoon conditions. It will include acute care rooms, private and group counselling rooms, vocational training facilities including a bakery, hairdressing salon and tailoring room.

This sustainable building, with passive solar design, will cost \$500,000. We are thrilled to have already funded one quarter of this and we will be breaking the remaining amount down into smaller, fundable chunks as part of our productisation strategy.

Vulnerable Children's Homes

In many cases it is children who are rescued from the depraved hands of traffickers.

Worldwide, almost one-third of trafficking victims are children, and this is no different in Nepal.

When the 3 Angels Nepal team rescue or intercept a child, or hear about a young person at risk of trafficking, they bring them to the safety of the children's home. It is not an orphanage, rather a place where these traumatised children can receive love, guidance and family support, while accessing the medical and psychological care they desperately need.

They benefit from nutritious meals and attend the 3 Angels Nepal school, where lifelong friendships are formed.

The Pokhara Project will include 14 new vulnerable children's homes for girls and boys who have been rescued from trafficking, or require protection from high-risk settings.

Each can accommodate between 10 and 12 young people depending on their ages.

They will home children like Mira*, who at just five years old was brought to the children's home by her parents who feared she would be taken and sold into prostitution. Mira grew up in one of the poorest communities in Nepal, where trafficking rings target the most vulnerable.

Today, 16-year-old Mira is bursting with love and laughter. She may never know how close she came to being trafficked. Instead her sights are firmly set on becoming a businesswoman and helping others less fortunate than herself, like 3 Angels Nepal helped her.

"I feel happy at home, there is a lot of love," she said. "I am thankful for all the opportunities I have received."

The 14 new homes planned for The Pokhara Project will be housed in seven new buildings.

These have been architecturally designed to help foster friendship and a sense of community among the children, with a central village green and plenty of shared community spaces.

Our End of Financial Year Appeal (EOFY) focused on raising money to fund these homes, and proved to be one of our most successful campaigns to date.

The construction of each home costs \$125,000 and our EOFY goal was to fully fund \bar{A} sā house. Our newly developed marketing team created high-quality promotional material that engaged with our current supporters and reached new donors.

Over just four weeks we received enough donations to fund nearly three quarters of Āśā house. On top of this an individual donor came forward with a one-off gift to completely fund Māyā house. We are so grateful for everyone's support and generosity during this campaign and we are looking forward to seeing more homes funded over the coming months.

Meeting Urgent Needs in the Field

Our 100% funding model means all money raised by Give Freedom International goes directly to the field to support The Pokhara Project.

However, a small amount is allocated to emergency needs on the ground.

This flexibility in our funding model empowers our Field Partner to respond quickly and effectively to any unforeseen challenges along the way. This year 3 Angels Nepal used this money to purchase a brand-new school bus for their students.

Previously the 3 Angels school had been using two buses to transport students to and from classes each day. After serving the school for many years, often in rural conditions and on bad roads, these much-loved buses broke down beyond repair.

That's where Give Freedom International stepped in to help.

The shiny, new yellow bus can safely transport 30 students at a time and has allowed the school to enrol an additional 50 students this year. It has meant our Field Partner can continue to give children from a range of backgrounds access to a high-quality education. School principal, Ramesh Pandey, explained the impact this new bus has had.

"When our buses broke down it was a really challenging time for us. I was using my personal car just to try and get children to school.

"Without transport we risked losing half our fee-paying students from the school, and without them we can't send our rescued children to school. So it really was desperate.

"This new bus is doing six trips every day and transporting 90 students to and from school. That's three trips in the morning to pick the students up and three in the afternoon to take them home.

"I am so thankful to have this bus. It has meant we have been able to enrol new students and continue to give these young people an education they deserve."

Student Hari^{*} added: "I am happy because I don't have to walk to school anymore, or get looked down on by people along the way. The travel time has cut in third! I can use this time for other activities."

The 3 Angels school serves children who have been rescued from trafficking, and those at risk, alongside full fee-paying students. This intentional mix of backgrounds is helping to break down damaging caste barriers, bringing children together as friends and helping to create a generation free from prejudice and discrimination.

A new school campus is part of The Pokhara Project and will enable 3 Angels Nepal to continue offering a high quality education to the young people of the region.



Your Impact

The financial year of 2022 has been one of significant growth for Give Freedom, with an impressive **29 per cent increase** in overall revenue. It is an extraordinary achievement, one very few organisations accomplish in their start-up phase, and we cannot thank you all enough for your support in helping us achieve this.

The rise can be attributed to the formal establishment of the Give Freedom Foundation, which saw our operational income increase from \$259,544 in 2021 to \$423,452 in the 2022 financial year.

As we adapt our funding model in line with our updated strategic direction, the result is a distinctly different dataset to the one we reported last year. Our program expenses for The Pokhara Project are lower and our operational income has more than doubled—as per our strategic direction to maximise our impact to support our field partner.

Program Expenditure

While we continue to support our Field Partner with emergency needs in the field, our priority and sights are on fully funding The Pokhara Project, which will increase 3 Angels Nepal's long-term capacity and sustainability.

Now plans have been drawn up, we have entered into the fundraising phase for The Pokhara Project. To maximise the impact of your giving we will wait for the project to be fully funded before construction begins. This is the most efficient, and cost effective process, and until then, program funds will be held with financial stewardship and transparency.

This approach is reflected in the program expenditure this year—\$45,289 versus the \$283,957 expended during the financial year 2021.

The majority of our program expenditure, \$43,969, went towards disaster relief and other emergency support. We are grateful our financial positioning enabled us to assist 3 Angels Nepal as the fallout from the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be felt.

Program funds were released during the last financial year, and the distribution of these in the form of emergency supplies, food and medical packs occurred during the 2022 financial year (as reported on page 24). Our emergency support has also kept more children at school with the purchase of a brand-new bus (see more on this on page 38).





Most of our staff work remotely, however we have the use of an official office in Newcastle. This has been donated, meaning there is no rent or overheads for Give Freedom.



Personnel

Our business model is structured so all core personnel are contractors, rather than employees. Financially speaking, this means there are no overheads for Give Freedom and staff costs are significantly lower. For personnel, it offers great flexibility in their work / life balance, a freedom we hold highly in our core values.
